### A few important reminders

- We would like to remind you about hats. These are essential in this hot weather and children without hats will be asked to remain in the shade during outside play times.
- The classrooms are open from 8.30a.m. Please do not drop children off earlier than 8.15am as their safety cannot be guaranteed. Children are not permitted in the classrooms until 8.30 as the teachers need this time to prepare for the day. It is also best that teachers are not in the classroom alone with a student.
- No vehicles are permitted to enter school grounds during school hours. The best
  places to park are on Owens Road or Victoria Road. Please be aware that there is a
  clear way area either side of the driveway on Owens Road that is regularly policed by
  Auckland Transport.
- All children are to be collected promptly after school unless enrolled in an After School Care programme.
- No children are to be in the staff car park at any time. Parents please walk your children around the administration building to exit the school on to Victoria Road.
- Please ensure the correct school uniform is worn to and from school, including footwear. Last year a number of children were leaving the school ground without their shoes on. We would like the children to take pride in their school uniform.
- Bicycles and scooters are to be walked in and out of the grounds. Children riding bikes to school on a regular basis are encouraged to wear a safety vest. These can be obtained from the office.
- Pupil absences are to be phoned in by 9.30a.m. Alternatively you can send in absences via the school app. Messages may be left on the answer phone. The Ministry of Education requires us to recognise the reason for the absence so please be specific.
- We would like to remind parents that we have some children who have severe life threatening food allergies. We ask families to assist us to protect these children by avoiding having nuts in school lunches. This includes whole nuts, products containing nuts, nutella and peanut butter. We appreciate this is an inconvenience but ask for your cooperation in this matter. We also ask parents not to bring cakes or sweets to school to share with the class on your child's birthday.

<u>School fees - Your invoice for school fees was sent out this week.</u>

You may pay the whole amount upfront, by term or by monthly, weekly or fortnightly automatic payments. If you are paying by automatic payment please note that compulsory fees will be paid off first and the non- compulsory ones thereafter. Please see the letter attached to your invoice for explanations of the fees

<u>International Students</u> - Next Friday we will be welcoming 7 International students from China. They will be spread across the classes and we trust that you will make them feel welcome.

<u>Tissues</u> - We ask if each family could please provide a box of tissues for their child's class.

<u>Waterwise</u> - The Waterwise programme for Year 6 children will be starting on <u>Thursday 21</u> <u>February</u>. Forms are going home today asking for parent helpers. Please return these forms promptly.

<u>Lunch orders</u> - If you would like to do a term order for sushi please note that will be for 9 weeks and start on the 13th February. EzLunch orders start on Friday 8th February for Pita Pit and Monday 11th February for Five Loaves.

**Road patrol training** - A reminder that the Road Patrol refresher training will be taking place on February 18th at 9.30am. Any parent that has volunteered for road patrol and has not done the training is asked to attend this training.
