Dear Parents,

The weeks are flying past and we only have just over 4 weeks left of the term. There is quite a lot happening over the next few weeks so please keep an eye on the shared calendar on the website.

Last Tuesday, the school had a special liturgy to burn the blessed palms from last year to create the ashes for Ash Wednesday. Then the children celebrated Mass with the Parish on Ash Wednesday. This marks the beginning of Lent.

Lent is an important season in our Church. We take this season seriously. We use it as a time to become closer to God. It's a time to remove distractions and to sharpen our focus so that we might better know God's ways and become more loving in the world, at school, and in our own homes, far beyond the 40 days of Lent.



Construction work

You may have noticed some construction work happening around the school. I decided to have some shelving moved in the holidays to create a more use-able resource room for the teachers, beside St Catherine (see photo of the finished room). This led to the discovery of some water leaking issues which have had to be rectified. The building area is roped off from the children as the contractors work to do the repairs.

St Patrick's Day

As our school was founded by the Sisters of Mercy who came from Ireland, it has been traditional to celebrate St Patrick's Day. It is St Patrick's Day this Sunday so we will celebrate on Monday. The children will still wear their school uniform, but can wear a green accessory to school - a hat, wig, scarf or another accessory that is green. The teachers will organise some activities to make the day special.

Parent teacher conferences

Conferences will take place on **Wednesday 3 April**. School will close at **1pm** on that day and conferences will commence at 2pm. The Pre-enrolment Evening is an opportunity for parents and their daughters to visit Carmel College and receive information about the college, including the 2020 enrolment process.




