In 2019, Maureen and the teachers will be reviewing the curriculum and teaching approaches with a view to promoting our philosophy of educating the whole child. The BoT will continue to focus on monitoring student progress and ensuring consistent reporting to parents under the curriculum objectives.

Tomorrow's Schools Review

At the end of 2018, the government's Independent Taskforce completed a review of education in New Zealand under the Tomorrow's Schools reforms that were introduced nearly 30 years ago.

The Taskforce's report, Our Schooling Futures: Stronger Together | Whiria Ngā Kura Tūātitini, recommends a number of changes to the governance, management, and administration of schools. As parents of children who will be affected by the proposed changes, we encourage you to familiarise yourselves with them and express your views. Public consultation on the report is open until April 7.
