Tena koutou everyone

It is wonderful to be back at school again and to be in lockdown level 1. This means we can get back into fairly normal routines while still taking note of recommendations from the Ministry:

- QR code posters continue to be on display at Alert Level 1 and we encourage you to scan
 when you are at the school, in case new cases emerge in our community.
- Maintain good cleaning, disinfecting practices and hygiene standards we will be doing this at school
- If you or your children are unwell please stay away from school
- Get tested if recommended to do so by health professionals.

This week's Catholic Character thought this week - The Rosary.

October is traditionally a month where we focus on praying the Rosary. Each class will be learning about a different mystery of the Rosary during RE time and will be praying the rosary each day. It

would be a good opportunity for families to also pray a decade of the Rosary together.



Why pray the Rosary?

In the rosary, we ask Mary to "pray for us sinners"—in other words, to join us in our prayer. Mary is "favoured" by God and "blessed among women," according to the angel Gabriel (Luke 1:28), because of the role as Mother of Jesus. So reciting the Hail Mary—a prayer rooted in the Gospel of Luke—makes sense: We ask Mary to join us in our prayer just as we would ask any close friend to pray with us, but Mary is much more than just another friend; Jesus appointed her as our "spiritual mother" (John 19:27).

At the same time, the rosary is a profoundly Christ-centered prayer. When we ask Mary to accompany us in praying the rosary, she leads us to Jesus (John 2:5). As we recite the prayers that make up the rosary (the Our Father, the Hail Mary, the Glory Be), we also meditate on the "mysteries" of God's plan of salvation as described in the Gospels: the announcement of Jesus' birth, his ministry, his Passion, his Resurrection and Ascension, and so on. (There are twenty mysteries of the rosary in all.)

If you would like a simple website to help you brush up on how to pray the Rosary, this one is pretty good. There are also Youtube clips available online.

out to you. It promises to be a very worthwhile event for our children to celebrate the Arts.

This Thursday marks the start of Waterwise again. The first term's sessions were interrupted by the lockdown so I'm sure the children are looking forward to getting back on the water again.




