

Nga mihi nui ki a koutou whānau, and a warm St Leo's blessing on you all

This weekend is Palm Sunday. This marks the beginning of Holy Week which is the most important part of the church calendar.

Holy Week is definitely a very sacred time of the year, for it is now that we will commemorate and remember the last week of Jesus' life on this earth. The Lenten season of sacrifice and self-denial is about to come to an end, but this coming week is extremely important for all Christians. The greatest focus of the week is the Passion (suffering) and Resurrection of Jesus Christ and the events that led up to it.

Especially important for Catholics is the Easter Triduum. This is the three days just before Easter. On Holy Thursday, we re-enact the Lord's Last Supper, His betrayal and arrest. At the Mass, the priest will wash the feet of twelve men, just as Jesus did.



On Good Friday, the day of the crucifixion and death of our Lord, we have the veneration of the Cross. A service is held at three o'clock in the afternoon, the hour Jesus is believed to have died. There is no consecration of the Eucharist on this day, and the Communion we receive will be from the night before, which has been reserved in the tabernacle.

School/Parish Mass

What a wonderful way to connect as a school/parish community when we celebrated Sunday mass as a whanau. It was great to see many families who were able to join us to celebrate this special occasion. We joined together to share kai and it was fantastic to hear such beautiful comments from the parish on how wonderful and respectful our children are. Thank you to all the families who were able to join us.





St Patrick's Day

The school celebrated St Patricks Day on 17 March with a liturgy. The children also iced biscuits which they shared after.



Whanau Dav

The students had a wonderful time (including the teachers and myself) on Friday afternoon. The Whanau leaders had prepared an afternoon of fun and games allowing the students to show tuakana-tenina as they took part in the activities. The children cheered for each other in their whanau teams and showed aroha at all times. There were even prizes for students who showed aroha and the school Mercy values.
