### Matariki Celebrations

# Visit to DEPOT Artspace

Depot is a unique arts organisation and ecosystem founded on the belief that nurturing creativity is essential to all of our lives and the future. Last week our tamariki visited this special space and had a tour led by Terehia Walker.

The themes for this visit were sustainability, climate change and composting. It is about how we care for our planet and natural resources. It was also great to have Ngahiwi Walker join the tour and play the Maori war trumpet which is called a Pūkāea.

Some of the artwork the students viewed on display were ketes made from harakeke, and pieces of artwork carved and weaved by our local artists, one of them being Ngatanahira Pona. Another main aspect of sustainability is the use of Māori medicine, such as kawakawa. Kawakawa is used in balms, teas and natural medicine. The tamariki also learnt about planting and taking care of harakeke. They are learning a karakia which they will use when planting harakere at school in September, during Māori Language Week.







#### **International Students**

We welcomed nine international students to St Leo's. Some will be with us for a week and one student will be here for six weeks. We are very excited to have them and they have all settled in well. Their St Leo's buddies have been great and are showing them our school Mercy values through everything they do.



#### **Science Roadshow**

Last term the children visited the Science Roadshow which was held at Wairau Intermediate. The tamariki had a wonderful time learning about sound and other science concepts through the hands on displays. This was the first time the whole school was able to visit and we are hoping to do it again next year.

#### **School/Parish Mass**

This term our school/parish Mass will be held on 27 August. Please mark this special day on your calendar. We would like everyone to attend as this will be the last school/parish Mass for the year.
