I was lucky enough to attend the New Zealand Principals' Conference in Queenstown. Thank you to NZPF for awarding the Don Le Prou Award for me to be able to do this. There were three amazing speakers who were inspiring and spoke about the importance of knowing your learner and building strong relationships to have successful learning outcomes. One way of doing this is through a system which the Finnish use (originally from the US) is called 'looping'. Looping refers to a teaching and learning approach where a teacher remains with the same group of students for more than one academic year, typically for two consecutive years. Instead of students moving on to a new teacher each year, they continue with the same teacher for an additional year. I was one of those principals who put their hand up and proudly said that this is what we do at St Leo's. The benefits of being in a small school. 
