St Clare News

St Clare has had an amazing start to the school year. We have welcomed three new students - Aleesa, Victoria and Callen and have a fourth student, Roger, starting next week.

All of us have enjoyed getting to know each other and making new friendships.

Our mercy value for this term is Aroha so we have looked at what love is and how we feel love. We also talked about God's love and what that looks like for us.

This week we made pancakes, ate pancakes, sorted pancakes by size, wrote about pancakes and read a poem about pancakes. Some of us might have enjoyed more pancakes than we should have but it was a really fun morning and a great introduction to the start of Lent.

We attended our first liturgy of the year and watched the palms be burnt followed by Ash Wednesday Mass.

A few reminders for the upcoming days:

- We would like to remind you about hats. These are essential in this hot weather and children without hats will be asked to remain in the shade during outside play times. Please stress to your children the importance of keeping their hats on when playing outside.
- No vehicles are permitted to enter school grounds during school hours. The best places to park are on Owens Road or Victoria Road. Please be aware that there is a clear way area either side of the driveway on Owens Road that is regularly policed by Auckland Transport. Please do not park across neighbours driveways.
- All children are to be collected promptly after school unless enrolled in the After School Care programme.
- No children are to be in the staff car park at any time. Parents please walk your children around the administration building to exit the school on Victoria Road.
- Please ensure the correct school uniform is worn to and from school, including footwear.
 Caps are not school uniform and neither are sneakers or crocs. Last year a number of children were leaving the school grounds without their shoes on. We would like the children to take pride in their school uniform. Don't forget the sunhats. School sunhats are available to purchase from the school office for \$15.
- Bicycles and scooters are to be walked in and out of the grounds. Children riding bikes to school on a regular basis are encouraged to wear a safety vest and must wear their helmet. These can be obtained from the office.
- Pupil absences are to be phoned in by 9.30a.m. Alternatively you can send in absences via the school app. Messages may be left on the answer phone. The Ministry of Education requires us to recognise the reason for the absence so please be specific.
- We would like to remind parents that we have some children who have severe life threatening food allergies. We ask families to assist us to protect these children by avoiding having nuts in school lunches. This includes whole nuts, products containing nuts, nutella and peanut butter. We appreciate this is an inconvenience but ask for your cooperation in this matter. We also ask parents not to bring cakes or sweets to school to share with the class on your child's birthday.

Waterwise Instructors Course

St Leo's needs new Waterwise Instructors – come join the team!

St Leo's is lucky enough to be part of the Devonport Peninsula Waterwise Programme which teaches all our Year 6 children water safety while learning to sail and kayak. Based at Narrow Neck beach, we run our sessions on Thursday mornings in Term 1, part of Term 2 and a few sessions in Term 4.

As a Waterwise instructor, you help to teach our children water confidence and basic sailing and kayaking skills. While a few children learn these skills from their family, for many it is entirely new. Seeing them develop confidence and challenge themselves outside of the classroom throughout Year 6 is an immensely rewarding experience.

Over the last few years St Leo's has benefited from a very dedicated group of volunteer instructors, many of whom no longer have children at the school. Every year we need some more parents to train as instructors so that we don't compromise our ability to continue to offer the Waterwise programme at our school. If there are not enough instructors, St Leos will simply be unable to run our sessions in the future. This year, 2024, we will only have 3 instructors with children still at St Leo's so it is time now to start training up parents who currently have children in years 2, 3 and 4.

The schedule for the next Waterwise Instructor Training course is **attached**. This will commence on the **10**th **April** with an evening session and will have trainees from all the schools in the Devonport Peninsula. I realise the time commitment required to do the course looks daunting but once it is completed your time is only needed on Thursday mornings. Most of our parent instructors have work commitments and we are able to factor that into our schedule so you don't have to make every session.

The course is extremely fun and provides a great opportunity to challenge yourself and make new friends. St Leo's instructors are heavily involved in the training course so if you have any questions please get in touch with me or corner one of the instructors (Aston, Clare or Fiona) in the school playground. Renee will point you in their direction. I look forward to hearing from you.


